Williams comes to SVCHS with a vast background of experiences to share with her patients. She received her BSN and Masters from King University in Bristol, TN. Williams is a native to the area and was born and raised in Saltville, VA. After graduating with her BSN, she worked at the Family Birth Center at Johnston Memorial Hospital for more than five years.

"As a labor and delivery nurse, I was privileged to get to take care of the hospital's littlest patients and their families. While I loved working in labor and delivery, I always knew I wanted to serve my home community so I made the decision to further my education to become a nurse practitioner," Williams said.

Williams is very excited to be part of the school-based program and said, "For as long as I can remember, I have always wanted to help people. As a nurse, I knew I wanted to give back to the community that instilled that desire in me. While I loved my job as a labor and delivery nurse I knew I somehow wanted to better serve my hometown. I felt that through working as a nurse practitioner I could best accomplish that goal. I am so excited to serve and care for the people of my hometown!"
